CIRCULATION DAY EVENT

Do you have items that are in great condition that you no longer use? It's time to get them back into circulation! **Circulation Day** keeps items out of landfills and gets them to anyone who can use them.

How does it work? September 8th-13th you can drop items at Hope during office hours. A collection table will be set up in the office hallway. After worship on the 15th, all items will be set on tables in the parking lot for the taking. Leftover items will be brought to charitable thrift shops. Start gathering stuff now!

What can we bring? We're starting out relatively small: Household items (kitchen, decor, small appliances, etc.), arts or crafts materials, tools, garden supplies, and office supplies.

What CAN'T we bring? Bring only what is listed above: no clothing, furniture, books, or particularly large items. We want to easily transport leftovers after the event. Be sure items are clean, in good repair, and not missing parts.

Who can take items? ANYONE! If you see something you want or need, just take it and get it back into circulation. Don't be shy about grabbing something you can use. If you see something that you think a family member or friend would like, feel free to take it for them as well. We'll be advertising the event through Lutheran Campus Ministry and around the Dinkytown neighborhood, but if you know anyone else who'd like to take a look around, invite them to stop by.

Are there ways that we can help other than donating items? Since Circulation Day is not a fundraiser, there is no need for pricing items, collecting money, or safeguarding against theft since everything is free! We will, however, need some help putting out the items, keeping things organized, and bringing leftover items to various thrift stores afterwards. President's Report: Open Doors and Open Hearts Volunteers Make It Happen

In this transition time, together, we are discerning: where is the Spirit leading us? Hope's volunteers are showing up, doing the next right thing, renewing our cherished 104-year-old church home, creating porous walls, and wide open hearts and doors.

Past capital campaigns have enhanced the beauty, functionality, and accessibility of our facilities. And now, this tradition of responsible stewardship continues:

- Volunteers have conducted assiduous research to select the most effective strategies to
 enhance the sanctuary sound system, to improve the audio experience for members of the congregation and
 our guests (supported by the donation).
- In keeping with the bold gothic architectural features of our church building, new v-grooved, white oak, sanctuary front doors, designed to be inviting, with larger leaded, insulated, clear glass windows, will soon be installed by Hope's volunteer corps of skilled craftsmen. (supported by Open Doors I).

The beauty of thoughtfully designed, carefully maintained facilities is a balm for our spirits, as expressed by theologian John O'Donohue, "When we experience the Beautiful, there is a sense of homecoming. We feel most alive in the presence of the Beautiful for it meets the need of our soul" (Beauty).

Hope's facilities are not ours alone to enjoy, but also the setting in which we extend a warm welcome, making for porous walls. Volunteers are re-imagining our Welcome Back Students tradition, on Sunday, September 15th, we will:

- Nourish our neighbors, serving Hope Bakes gourmet pizza.
- Highlight our commitment to sustainability with a Circulation Day.
- Promote civic engagement as a voter registration site.
- Support wellness with a team from the office of Minneapolis Transportation Planning who will offer information about their planned Marcy Holmes Dinkytown ADA Pedestrian Improvement Project and request feedback.

Please invite folks to participate in these activities; they will also be publicized by our ministry partner, Lutheran Campus Ministry, and the office of Minneapolis Transportation Planning.


Worship and Music

2025 Trust Board Grant Applications Due September 30th

The Hope Trust Board is now accepting applications for 2025 grants; the application deadline is September 30, 2024. Tentative funding decisions will be announced in October 2024, with final funding amounts decided (based on year-end financials) and distribution of funds in early 2025.

Every year ULCH members are invited to submit requests for funds in accordance with the Trust charter. An emphasis on enhancing and extending the life and mission of the congregation are given priority and may include:

- support for domestic and foreign missions
- scholarships
- professional staff for special services
- community projects, and
- building expansion or improvements(contrasted with routine building maintenance which is not fundable).

The same project or program is eligible to receive funds for a maximum of three separate grant cycles. Depending on the availability of funds, a request may be fully or partially supported. Routine or regular church expenses are not eligible for Trust funds.



Fall Adult Forum Plans

Christian Nationalism will be a focus of the Sunday Forum series later this fall while offering opportunities for spiritual care and support during this politically tempestuous season. The goal is to survive and even thrive together, to remain connected, and to be equipped to reach out to the politically other with compassion and understanding while remaining grounded in who we are. We hope to have three sessions. Starting on September 29, Jerry Gale, a member of Hennepin Avenue Methodist Church, will speak on the topic, "Understanding and Responding to Christian Nationalism." The following week on October 6, Michael Reszler of the Aspen Institute will lead a session entitled, "Crossing Borders." On October 13, we have tentatively planned a practical Isaiah-based workshop on how to engage the politically other.

No forum will be held on September 15 due to two major community events following worship – the pizza bake and Circulation Day. I have mentioned before that budgeting the monthly Giving amount can be difficult because while the amount of an annual or bi-annual pledge is known, the timing is not. This month we received a contribution that, while we weren't surprised it was given, we didn't know it was coming in July. With that, our General Giving is better than budget by \$34K; YTD General Giving is \$40K better than budget. Rental Income is still better than budget because of construction parking. YTD our Rental Income is \$22K better than budget.

As I mentioned last month I expected to see Salary & Benefits higher than budget due to various final payouts that needed to happen for Jen and the overlap of these expenses with Pastor Susan's arrival. Going forward and until there is a permanent Director of Worship and Music our Salaries & Benefits will be slightly better than budget.

Operation expenses were over budget by \$4K due to tree work and parking lot repairs that were needed. Even with these expenses YTD Operation's Expenses are less than \$1K over budget.

Our Building Fund has a value as of \$200K as of 7.31.2024. Our new front doors should be installed by the end of the summer. We have paid 50% of the expense of these doors. When the other invoice is paid it will be from this fund. As we know this fund is also used to help pay our mortgage. Each month \$6.9K is transferred to our general fund to help pay for the mortgage. July's transfer will happen with the August transfer.
