I have a practice of waking up earlier than anyone else in my house to read a novel while drinking my morning coffee. A couple of weeks ago when I walked into the kitchen to make my coffee, the moon was shining so brightly through the windows that I could see the shadows of the trees on my kitchen floor. I was filled with both awe and humility simply by noticing the light of the full moon on a dark morning.

We are living through an immensely tense, anxious, and stressful time within our congregational life, nationally, and globally with the ongoing climate crisis. Some of us are also navigating health issues, caring for ailing loved ones, facing the realities of grief,

and so much more. And while we all respond to stressors in a variety of ways, we live in a culture that often gives us unhelpful messages in these times: work harder, buy stuff, do more. Contrary to these messages, however, our scriptures and faith practices encourage us to pray, to connect, to be present to what is - to slow down.

What are you noticing these days? Are there practices or rhythms in your life that already sustain you through anxiety and stress? Are there relationships or places within creation that help you to feel grounded and present? As we move through this season of Epiphany and prepare for the season of Lent, you are invited to slow down, to pay attention. Let us not underestimate the power of being prayerful and connected people, grounded in the grace of God.
